OC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS – MAY 2022

The **July Board Meeting** was held on Thursday, 7th of July. Below is a summary of what took place at the Board meeting. Complete approved minutes are found on the website after the following Board Meeting.

The usual reports were delivered to the Board: previous month's minutes, Membership stats, and Treasurer's Report. The VP's reports were also shared and notes below reflect some of the discussion generated by these reports as well as our Old ϑ New Business topics.

VP for Admin: Committee Chair appointments were offered and approved for the admin side of the house. Happy Hours will continue to be scheduled. Summer Picnic date has been changed to August 21st due to low signups for July date. Seafood Festival Bus will be scheduled for Saturday, Sept 10th.

VP for Organized Skiing: offered (and was approved) Ray Sokol to be Assistant Trips Chair. Questions were posed about day bus sign up procedures – no changes to discuss at this time.

Signups for skiing / events: Are there any options beside PayPal to make it less expensive? Answer is not really. If we had our own vendor account to accept credit card payments we would have to pay the bank a monthly vendor account fee plua a minimum of 6% on each transaction.. cost would need to be passed onto member.. PayPal is just a little over 3%.

Website: Discussion on content and how to manage old events. Our new Webmaster will keep working on the site.

Expo: Still no confirmation on resumption of show this year.

Volleyball Tournament coming up. We need volunteers for each of the 3 days. Friday – setup 9am – 2pm; Saturday 7am – 9pm; Sunday 10am – 1pm. Just a couple of hours of your time will help make a difference to our major fundraising event.
