Alpine Bus Committee



The Buses Are Rolling, the Season is in Full Swing

As I write this on a Tuesday, the bus to Whiteface 1/26 has met the minimum numbers. I expect more sign ups as the week progresses. We started combining Alpine and Nordic skiing on the same bus. Many great Nordic resorts are located near Alpine mountains like Whiteface and Mt. Van Hoevenberg. This allows the two groups to mingle and share adventures on the bus. The buses are lively get-togethers with sharing of snacks and beverages. We still hand out water on the trip home.

In February, Alpine buses go to Sugarbush, Okemo, Pico, Whiteface, Gore, Magic and Plattekill. Variety is the "spice of life," and we try hard to keep up the variety. Nordic, where possible, will be combined with Alpine buses when possible. Viking Nordic, Mt Van Hoevenberg, Garnet, Prospect are just a few being offered.

Just a few notes: The buses always leave Crossgates at 7 am BUT THE SUGARBUSH BUS 2/2 WILL LEAVE AT 6:30 AM due to distance. It usually takes 15-20 minutes for the bus to arrive at the second stop. So be sure you are

at the second stop no later than 15 minutes after the Crossgates start.

Every mountain has a different method for getting lift tickets, so pay close attention to each sign-up process. Dates matter, so be sure you have the correct date.

You can sign up for the bus online, or come to a meeting, or sign up on a bus for a future bus. We try hard to make it easy for you. We do refunds of seats at meetings only. Or you can cancel (24 hour notice please) and roll over the seat money to another bus. We do keep a list of rollover names. Just email or see us at the meeting. The Feb 29 Winter Carnival bus will be up shortly and we have many buses listed before that date. We update the bus sign up grid every week. You can buy your Plattekill lift tickets on the event calendar. See you on the bus. Snow Dances are definitely helping.

Pray for lots of snow.



Its narrow historic streets, lined by restaurants and bars, are an excellent destination to celebrate the New Year. The city also kicked off an annual festive program of events, full of music, art, and outdoor fun with a new one: the Toboggan Run.

Because of the wet weather, the ground was too wet/soft to set up the Ferris Wheel but there were stages for music, fire pits and ice bars galore. And then there were the fireworks... yup, there were technical difficulties but we did see one set of flares at Midnight.
