The Buses Continue to Roll!



We had 50 on the Feb. 16 bus to Gore. That's what we like--lots of members taking advantage of a cheap bus ride to a ski resort. As I write this, I am packing for my family trip to Salt Lake City. Barbara will be joined by Eileen Finn-Lematty for the two weeks I am gone. Thanks, Eileen, for helping us. The table does need two people.

The good news is the bus schedule has been updated. A printable PDF is available on the bus page at https://ocskiclub.org/skiing/downhill-skiing-snowboarding/ski-buses/ Just scroll down the page to find a printable PDF file that summarizes the remaining schedule. It will also have the Nordic schedule. We are now scheduling buses to both an Alpine location and the nearest Nordic location for the same bus.

Changes and Additions:

3/6 Sugarbush bus is changed to 4/1 to take advantage of the bonus ticket on the "3rd Best Deal" offer. When we set this up, Sugarbush did not inform us that the bonus ticket is useable only on or after 4/1. In addition, for the Nordic crowd we added a visit to Ole's Nordic just north of Sugarbush.

3/23 Mt. Snow Reggae Fest and pond skimming party is back; so we moved the 3/24 Sunday bus to 3/23 Saturday. Nordic will go to Prospect Mountain.

4/8 Whiteface is the Eclipse bus. Yes, we were offered a great deal by the Mountain (thanks to Lauren, our rep). For a **\$40 lift ticket** (cash collected on the bus) you get to view the full solar eclipse. I am hoping to take two buses to this super event. Bring the kids (7+ years old) and grandparents (they don't have to ski) to experience this "once in a lifetime" event.

We will schedule buses through April following the snow conditions. Hopefully, we will run a June bus to Killington this season (dreaming big here). Keep checking the website for bus information after 4/8. We should have at least two more. If the Moguls Pig Roast revives at Killington, we will try to run a bus for that event.

Looking ahead to next season -- give us your suggestions. We are looking into running at least one bus to Hickory for old times' sake. Many have said how much they loved that mountain in the past, and now it has reopened.

Keep up the snow dances as we are at last getting the snow. Happy Trails and Trees to all!


Sunday River, Maine (Feb. 4-9)

Election Day Is Not Far Away ... The OC Ski Club election, that is!

Nominations: March 7 & 14 Election Night: March 28

Our Club is led by a group of volunteers who work very hard for you. Some of the leaders are voted in by the membership while others (Committee Chairs) are appointed by those elected officials (Officers and Board Members). Our process is quite simple but it all begins with YOU! Nominations are open at two consecutive business meetings (Thursday nights) on March 7 and 14 from 7pm-8pm. The nominations are made by the members in an open meeting forum. This is your opportunity to promote a person you think would be an excellent leader for the Club. Once nominated, that person has the option to accept the nomination or decline it.

Election night is another Thursday night meeting–March 28–after the second night of nominations, using paper ballots. All members in good standing are given instructions on how to vote. Each year the Club offices open up for election: President, VP Administration, VP Organized Skiing, Treasurer, Secretary and the Board of Directors (9 or 10 seats will be elected).

Why would you want to be an Officer or Board Member of the Club? First, be assured that most of our roles in the Club are not difficult work. Of course, there are days when any one of our current officers and committee chairs could tell you a different story but thankfully those times are not frequent. SO

- Have you enjoyed the activities that the Club provides? Would you like to see them continue? Would you like to see some new ones or the return of some old favorites?
- ✤ Are you good with people?
- Do you possess common sense?
- Do you have a few hours a month that you can give to the Club (Board members)?
- Do you have a few hours a week that you can give to the Club (officers)?
- Do you have some ideas for keeping the Club strong, yet fresh?

This is your opportunity to jump on board and get involved. The Club has survived, and thrived, these many years by combining the skills and knowledge of people who have been dedicated for years and also "new" people with the energy, enthusiasm and ideas to keep the Club moving forward in the pursuit of skiing and fun. The Club thrives on the energy and skills that our diverse membership provides. Whatever your reasons for considering a run for a position as an Officer and/or Board Member–don't just think about it but explore it by coming forward and finding out more about each position.

Is your interest at least a little piqued? I am including the "official" descriptions of the positions below but feel free to contact me if you would like more information!

The **President** of the CLUB is also the Chair of the Board of Directors and shall preside at all meetings. The President shall call all meetings of the CLUB and of the Board of Directors as provided in this Constitution and By-Laws. The President shall be a member ex officio of all committees. The President shall represent the CLUB to all other ski organizations. The President shall have the authority to sign legal documents and make disbursements on behalf of the CLUB as provided in this Constitution and By-Laws. The President shall submit a written report assessing the year's activities. This report shall be made part of the permanent records of the CLUB.

The <u>Vice President for Administration</u> shall assume all duties of the President of the CLUB in the event of the President's absence. The Vice President for Administration shall be a member of the Board of Directors and shall act as an ex officio member of all committees in administration's functional area.

The <u>Vice President for Organized Skiing</u> shall assume all duties of the President and the Vice President for Administration in the event of their absence. The Vice President for Organized Skiing shall be a member of the Board of Directors and shall act as an ex officio member of all committees in organized skiing's functional area.

The <u>Treasurer</u> shall be the Financial Officer of the CLUB, a member of the Board of Directors, and a member of the Finance Committee. The Treasurer shall make all disbursements as provided by this Constitution and By-Laws. The Treasurer shall receive all monies due to the CLUB, and shall receipt same. The Treasurer shall make an accounting of the receipts, expenditures, and financial condition of the CLUB at each regular meeting, and also at other times as may be required by the President or Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall keep and maintain, as a permanent record, all tax records of the CLUB. The Treasurer shall make a financial report and provide the new treasurer with said report within six (6) weeks after the end of the CLUB year.

The <u>Secretary</u> shall be a member of the Board of Directors and shall keep and maintain, as a permanent record, minutes of all meetings of the CLUB and of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall maintain a permanent file of all correspondence with ski areas and other clubs within the New York Capital District Ski Council. The Secretary shall keep all corporate records, except those pertaining to the office of the Treasurer, which shall be open to the inspection of members at all reasonable times. Copies of the Constitution and By-Laws shall be kept by the Secretary to be distributed to any member upon request.

A <u>Board of Directors</u> shall serve to assure that the activities of the CLUB are within the scope of this Constitution and By-Laws and are consistent with the NOT-FOR-PROFIT Corporation Law of the State of New York. The Board of Directors shall act as an Advisory Committee to the CLUB.

VP for Administration

- Plans for the Installation Party for the last Friday or Saturday in April are underway. The Hilton in Troy and the SUNY Culinary Arts School are possibilities.
- Membership: See Membership Statistics attachment. Memberships are increasing slightly.
- A suggestion for fundraising is to bring back popular T-shirts from the past.

VP for Organized Skiing

- Bus numbers are increasing. XC participation is slow, but weather and snow conditions have not encouraged XC skiing.
- Jay Peak is open, Burke will accommodate participants for the next couple of days, and there is room for one male on Sunday River.
- Winter Carnival will have prizes, a Heaney Wienie Roast, and some bar games as well as a fire hose race and tug of war on the snow. The cafeteria and bar will be open for purchase of food and drinks. The bus signup list is open.
- Sylvia explained that junior ID cards were issued to meet the mountain's requirements to have an ID for each NYCDSC discount ticket purchased. They were never required on the ski bus. Guest cards are given to each guest riding the bus and are collected on the way home from the mountain.

Old Business

- The member mixer on January 25 had lower attendance than expected, possibly due to a lack of sufficient advertising. New member attendance was particularly low. Nevertheless, in order to generate more interest in attending meetings and encourage member retention, the motion to hold another on March 7 was passed. The Board approved an appropriation of \$500 for beverages for the March 7 member mixer.
- Matt will coordinate the arrangements for the mixer with the help of Judy and Kelly.
- Member retention was also discussed. Renewed interest in riding buses, successful trips, and combining XC and downhill buses are helping in the recovery of our activities after the dark years of Covid.

New Business

• Discussion on the proposal by Rex Lyons to sell 50/50 tickets on buses and other OC events was lively. It was decided to continue to sell tickets at meetings and certain events, but not on buses.

<u>Monday</u>: Competitive co-ed 4's <u>Tuesday</u>: Competitive and recreational co-ed 6's


