Hey everyone! As we gear up for booking our out west ski trip, we're thrilled to announce that this season we'll be exploring 2 Ikon and 1 Epic destination with our amazing tour operator.

And guess what? For those who purchase through our special link, you'll receive a fantastic \$50 land package credit for full Epic or Ikon passes, and a \$30 land package credit for Epic Local or Ikon Base passes. How awesome is that?

Some fantastic savings up for grabs. First-time Ikon pass holders can enjoy \$90 off the new Ikon pass price (now \$1159 instead of \$1249), and the Ikon Base pass is available at \$829 instead of \$869. Renewal pricing is even \$10 less! Please note that there's no group pricing program for the Ikon Base Plus pass.

This group member pricing offer will be valid until the beginning of September, but remember that price increases will kick in. The first deadline to lock in the lowest pricing is May 3rd, so don't miss out on these amazing deals!

## Alpine Bus Committee



We have ended the ski/ride Season on a great note. The 4/21 bus to Killington and Moguls Pig Roast was a huge success. A nearly full bus of OCers arrived to ski/ride on a mountain of soft, slushy snow. Even the trees were doable. I did Low Rider but I must confess I was not happy! But we did it! Superstar will definitely last well into May and maybe even June.

The Bus Committee is finished with 2023-24 season. We are working on the next season. We have already scheduled the Winter Carnival 3/14 at Pico. Put that date on your calendar and be sure to request that Friday off from work! We will try to offer more dates at Stratton, Okemo and Mt. Snow, 3 mountains that are very popular with our membership. I know the Indy Pass is no longer available (Magic) but the IKON, EPIC and the NY Ski 3 are available. In the Fall, there will be a 4 Mountain Pass from Vermont (sold only on 1 day for about 20 minutes) and the Ski3 Frequent Skier card from ORDA, NY. We encourage you to purchase these passes. The mountains prefer the use of passes rather than discounting day purchase of lift tickets. Our discount prices will not be lower than the use of these passes.

Which pass to purchase will be your greatest issue. NY Ski3 is for Belleayre, Gore and Whiteface. IKON is for Killington/Pico (5 or 7 days combined) and Stratton (unlimited). EPIC is good at Okemo, Mt. Snow, and Hunter. All 3 are unlimited. Our most popular bus was to Gore (9 times). Killington was on the schedule 4 times just for early and late season. We had Pico buses scheduled but they only ran a few times. We did not offer Hunter as we could not contact anyone at that mountain who could make arrangements with us. Halfway through the season, Barbara finally made contact with agents who represented Stratton, Okemo and Mt. Snow and was able to negotiate discount lift tickets and dates. Those 3 mountains will be offered more but that means we probably will offer fewer Gore dates. Bromley is the only mountain who is still not interested in our business. We will try again to set up a couple of dates as we know how much our members like this friendly mountain.

One change initiated this season was the combination of Nordic and Alpine skiers on one bus. We will continue this into the next season. The 2 separate committees will operate as one until the Nordic group gets large enough to run their own buses. Cathy Marvin will be joining Barbara and me as we do a better job of coordinating the 2 groups. MT Van Hoevenberg, Garnet Hill, Mountain Top Inn, Prospect Mountain, Viking Nordic are places we will match with Alpine mountains. Of course most of the Alpine mountains also have their own Nordic courses but I now know that our XCtry skiers like long tracks. Going round and round on short tracks of 3-5 Km is not really fun. But hey, our Alpine skiers will ski all day on the same short 1000 Meter run. What do we know??? Have a great summer and know that the "behind the scenes" work is going on. We will run a bus to Big Snow in August and September so you can get your "legs" in shape. Look for our announcements in the August LiftLine. Now back to my golf game.
