The Annual Budget Vote Meeting is Oct 10th!

The 2024-2025 budget vote is on **Thursday, October 10th, 6:30-9:00 p.m.** at the PCC.

2024-25 Budget Proposal

In this fiscal year which ends May 31, 2025 we are projecting a budget deficit like last year, only smaller. The summary of this forecast is in the table below. We project that our dues, a little higher than last year, will continue to be lower than in pre-pandemic years. Public relations costs will be much lower now that the new website is complete. Ski bus expenses are the biggest unknown as usual. For budget purposes we are assuming a similar number of buses this year as last year but this may be wrong.

The net result is a projected loss of \$12,700. But considering we had large net surpluses during the pandemic years, a loss of this magnitude can easily be absorbed for several more years before we need to raise prices. The Board of Directors recommends the approval of this proposed budget which will be put to a vote next month.

Alpine Bus Committee

The Season has begun! Our first bus will be **Saturday, Oct. 26, to Big Snow,** American Dream Mall, NJ. The bus will leave Crossgates Commons from our NEW BUS STOP behind Walmart (<u>see map on the website</u>). The bus leaves at 8:00 a.m., and departs from the American Dream Mall at 6:30 p.m. to return to Albany.

We have booked a two-hour slot - 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. - at Big Snow. You can ride the bus up or (down). Lift tickets are \$39 per person, a discount price. You must purchase the lift ticket by noon online or at the meeting on Thursday, Oct 24, prior to trip. (Tickets can be purchased either by paying in person at regular meetings or by PayPal on our website.) There is so much to do at the Mall that we are staying to let our membership enjoy it: indoor amusement park with roller coasters, indoor water park, two indoor miniature golf courses, Lego Land, and so much more. Explore the Mall on their website. You must prepay for most of these places ahead of time. There are also numerous stores and restaurants to enjoy.

We are returning to **Big Snow on Nov. 16** and our first outdoor date is **Dec. 8 at Killington.** The tentative schedule for buses is posted on our website. For this year, we have combined Alpine (downhill) with Nordic (cross country). Our buses will visit both destinations to drop off members. All buses leave Crossgates Commons at 7:00 a.m. and leave the last destination at 4:30 p.m. on weekdays and 5:00 p.m. on weekends.

The Bus Committee is looking for volunteers to run a bus. We will do training Nov. 14 at the PCC. Just send us an email to ocbus@ocskiclub.org that you want to help. A bus leader gets a free bus seat. The job is not difficult as we don't collect money on the bus. It's a matter of making announcements, taking attendance (yup, just like in high school) and seeing that the trash is picked up.

If you have any questions or suggestions, please visit our table at regular meetings every Thursday. Our bus table will be open 6:30-8:30 p.m. You can pay in person with cash or check at meetings. You can pay online using our PayPal account. And we've heard your requests: You asked for more Stratton dates and we added them. You asked for buses to leave the mountain on weekends at 5, we did that. You asked for discount tickets to Okemo and Mt. Snow and we got them. So check out the new schedule. As we get closer to the outdoor ski/ride season, we will have those ticket prices for you online.

A suggestion: if you don't have an IKON pass and want to ski Sugarbush with us, grab their "Best Deal" \$99 offer NOW. It is on limited sale. We've scheduled two buses to Sugarbush.

We are very excited for the upcoming season. Start those Snow Dances and get your equipment tuned!

You'll have a 2-hour period for skiing, starting when you go through the door to the lifts. We can reload our ski equipment on the bus before enjoying other activities.

Family Corner



Hello OC Families!

We are back, planning for the 2024-25 ski season. The Smuggler's Notch and Jay Peak trips are scheduled. We have new trip leaders from the Family group. Chris Bendon and Colleen Bruecken Hudson will be the leaders for Smuggler's Notch, Martin Luther King Weekend, January 17-20, 2025. This is always a fun trip to a great mountain. April 4-6, 2025, are the dates for Jay and the leader will be Tracy Cook. Watch for the opening of Smuggs in October and, later in the fall, the opening of Jay. Both are drive-ups and families are welcome!

Seasonal rentals. So many children of members grow out of equipment, and it is costly to keep buying new or even used equipment for kids. But with a seasonal rental from one of the local ski shops, you get skis, boots, poles, and bindings (naturally) or snowboard with boots and bindings. They are professionally adjusted to your child's skill level, age, and yes, weight. And if the child grows out of the boot size, you can go back to the shop and trade in the current boot for a bigger fitted boot. My grandson needed larger boots midseason last year. We went back to the shop and they fitted him and adjusted the ski bindings at no charge. So easy. Seasonal rentals are also great for returning skiers who have taken several years off and find their old skis so "out of date." Consider seasonal rentals also for newbie adults who want to learn but are not sure if they will enjoy the sport. Rentals at the mountain for one day cost almost as much as seasonal rentals from local shops! High Adventure, Rte. 7, Latham, just reopened for the season August 1. Play It Again Sports, Rte. 7, Latham, rents both skis and snowboard packages. Alphin Haus, Amsterdam and Clifton Park, also rent equipment. Consider Steiners in Glenmont and Valatie, Alpine Sports Shop, Saratoga Springs, or Sports Page, Queensbury, which specializes in racing equipment as well as general ski and snowboard. Tune Skis, Glenville, has snowboard, cross-country and downhill skiing rentals. These local shops have reasonable rates, provide maintenance, and support the local snowsports clubs.

Also be sure to get your equipment tuned at the beginning of the season, and during the season. Here in the east, we have ice and that means sharp edges. My rule of thumb is beginning, midseason, and, if I am going out west, then too. The Club has a professional ski school and provides clinics about boot fitting, stance, fitness and, best of all, tuning skis. Want to learn more? Talk to Jeff Kenton, our ski school director, at any meeting.

Next year beginning in August, the Family Committee will put on a workshop at the PCC on Board meeting night about seasonal rentals, answering all your questions. **Big Snow, NJ, Oct. 26, Saturda**y, will be the first official bus of the season. Kids (age 7-17) are welcome to ride the bus and drive-downs are allowed. You can pay for bus seats and 2-hour lift ticket: \$39 (a \$30 savings) via PayPal online September 17 or at meetings starting October 3. Big Snow is at the Meadowlands Sports Complex, NJ, and American Dream Mall. See the event schedule for details. The bus back won't leave until 6:30 p.m. This is a family event. Guests are welcome too!

Remember, the first stop for buses has changed -- now behind Crossgates Commons, across from the lower level of Walmart. See the map on the Alpine Bus web pages. Do those snow dances!

Sharpen Your Skills

December 13-15, Whiteface Mountain Accommodations: The Golden Arrow, Lake Placid

Our annual **pre-season meeting will be on Thursday, October 10** at 6:00 pm sharp in the PCC upstairs room. We will discuss plans for the season, indoor and on-the-snow training, and private lesson days. Brian Mieczkowski will discuss training plans. ANNUAL OC CLINICS

FUNCTIONAL MOVEMENT SCREEN — Thursday October 24. PCC big room - Brian Mieczkowski. 5:30 p.m. Identify imbalances in mobility and stability during fundamental movement patterns, where the patterns are given a numerical score. Once deficiencies have been identified, corrective exercises can be developed with the goal of preventing injuries. To participate in the test, wear gym clothes. Testing will be limited - sign up at a meeting or contact Jeff.

STANCE AND BALANCE BOOT CLINIC — Thursday November 21. PCC big room - Garrick Dardani. 6:00 p.m. What you need to know about ski boots and how they affect your skiing comfort and performance. New for this season will be an update on the latest technology with all ski equipment. Garrick Dardani is Steiner's Sports master boot fitter.

<u>CONDITIONING & PREVENTING SKI INJURIES</u> — Thursday December 12. PCC big room - Kelly Chang. 6:00 p.m. Injuries and wear and tear on the knees and other weight-bearing joints are unfortunately common among skiers. Learn about types of ski injuries and how to prevent them with Kelly Chang, a physical therapist and avid skier. The clinic will include 15-20 minutes of education followed by a strength and conditioning circuit designed specifically for skiers to build strength and prevent injuries. **Wear gym clothes** if you wish to participate.

<u>SKI CARE & TUNING CLINIC</u> – *January 9, 2025. 6:00 p.m. Jeff Kenton.* Learn how to take care of your skis, minor maintenance and repairs for the do-it- yourselfer, what to look for when buying used skis, etc. A complete sharpen and wax tune-up will be done at this clinic.



OC Snowsports School is a PSIA-certified school providing coaching as a free benefit for all members. Our instructors will be available whenever we run a single-day bus. There will be at least 3 private-lesson days where you can request your instructor for individual feedback. This season we will make instructors available on some of the drive-up days.
